

7TH WAS LUCKY FOR THE GIANTS

Millville Lost Well-Played Contest at Inlet Park Yesterday.

FINAL SCORE WAS 5 TO 1

Millville Held Lead Until Sixth and Lost in Seventh—Had Big Opportunity in Ninth.

A collapse of the Millville defense in the seventh inning allowed the Bacharach Giants to tally three runs and win yesterday's game with Millville at Inlet Park, Atlantic City. The score was 5 to 1.

The Millvillians held the lead until the sixth inning, having pushed a run

over in the third that looked awfully good the way things were going.

The lone tally came when Yim, after being hit with a pitched ball, advanced to second on Taylor's muff of Roberts' peg to catch him napping. Yost after fouling off half dozen finally fanned. Lennox beat out an infield hit and Nelson slammed one over short that chased Yim over.

The run looked big enough to carry home as the big end of the score with Clancy going the way he was. Hutchinson was the only Giant who could do anything with his delivery and he dented it for three hits, one of which was a two-bagger: It came in the second inning and was hit over Yim's head. It was not a difficult chance for the spry outfielders but he lost the bat in the sun.

~ The Giants' Runs

The resort crowd obtained the run which tied the score in the sixth. Shively by a great slide into first beat out an infield hit and was sacrificed to

second. He went to third while Clancy threw out. Lloyd Taylor singled to right scoring him. Hopkins stopped Taylor's attempt theft of bag number two by a pretty peg to Seiferman.

But the real damage came in the seventh. Pugh, the first man up, walked. Hutchinson slammed a scorching boulder to the right of Yost. He al-

most pulled a spectacular one hand stop but the ball was too hot for him and both men were safe. Johnson bunted toward short and Clancy fell down fielding the ball. The bases were loaded when Roberts hit savagely to Lennox who pegged to Hopkins forcing Pugh. Hopkins in an endeavor to complete a double play overthrew Seiferman, who covered first, and two runs came in. Poles launched a fly to right field which Yim traced after and dropped, allowing Roberts to count.

The Giants got another run in the eighth. Lloyd singled to left and went

to second when Hopkins dropped a ball. Hopkins' throw reached Helfrich in time to prevent him from stealing third but the latter failed to tag him. He counted when Clancy threw badly to first on Hutchinson's roller.

Pitched Good Game

Jim Clancy pitched good enough ball to win. He had the dusky lads guessing all the time and with any kind of breaks would have won. He had a baffling assortment of curves and a puzzling change of pace that kept the darkies guessing.

Millville had a big opportunity in the ninth. Seiferman, first up, walked. Hopkins was hit by a pitched ball. Hogan, batting for Clancy, walked. Robinson fled out to right field. The fly was short and Seiferman after getting half way home, went back to third. In the meantime Hopkins had advanced to third and Hogan to second. In the mixup Seiferman attempted to get home and was nailed at the plate. Yost hit a terrific drive that Hutchinson scooped up with his eyes closed, ending the game. The score:
